WORDS FROM THE CEO

It's that time of year when we gather the achievements over the last 12 months and commence planning the 2023/2024 Annual Budget. The Shire hopes to adopt the budget in August 2023.

Council is working on the final draft this coming week which will provide for another busy year with roads, infrastructure, some community engagement sessions and upgrades around the town.

I am thankful to have had a staff member to be able to support the post office opening hours. It is great to see how having this asset still opening to support you all. We must thank the Katanning Post Office for their assistance in the short term.

The Shire of Woodanilling has appointed the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC) to conduct its 2023 Local Government Ordinary Election in October by means of postal voting.

And for the first time, as part of Tranche 1 of the Local Government Act Reforms optional" preferential voting will be inforce during the election process.

Preferential voting is the same method used in state and federal elections. Optional preferential voting means you are not required to provide all preferences in casting your vote.

The WAEC will be holding information sessions in the coming months and will commence the process. The Shire understands that 3 vacancy seats will be open. Should you wish to discuss this, please do not hesitate to pop in and see me on this.

The Shire recently engaged a consultant to commence the Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan. Details will following in the coming months on these sessions.

Local Government Reform and the October 2023 Local Government Elections

Dear Resident,

As the new Local Government Minister, I am honoured to oversee the implementation of the Government's major reforms of the local government sector, the most significant in 25 years. At the heart of these reforms is our aim of increasing the transparency, accountability and efficiency of local government in WA.

Some changes will be introduced at the upcoming October local government elections which will give ratepayers a greater say on who they elect to represent them on council. All electors will need to be aware of these changes when casting their vote.

One important change is the switch to Optional Preferential Voting (OPV). This will bring local government elections in line with state and federal government elections. Under OPV you will be able to choose one or more candidates by numbering them in order of your preference.

For many smaller councils, reforms will also see changes to council representation, with the removal of wards and standardisation of the number of councillors aligned to the population of the districts they serve.

These changes will strengthen local democracy and give ratepayers a greater choice of candidates. As a result, the reforms will increase community confidence in local government and make councils more representative and responsive to ratepayers' needs.

For 12 years, I served as a councillor and later as Deputy Mayor at the City of Stirling so I have first-hand experience and an appreciation of the importance of local government and how it impacts the lives of residents in many ways. So it is vital that people get involved in their local government, either by nominating to be a community representative or by voting to have a say on who represents you on council.

Local Government Reform

Voting in the October 2023 Local Government Elections

The State Government is putting into action the most significant reforms to the local government sector in 25 years. The reforms will increase the transparency, accountability and efficiency of local government in WA.

One of the key reforms is the change from 'first past the post' system of voting to optional preferential voting (OPV).

This change will be introduced for the October 2023 local government elections which will now be in line with state and federal elections.

OPV will strengthen democracy by giving ratepayers a greater choice of candidates.

How to vote under the optional preferential voting system

It is really easy and it is all about choices – your choices. Just imagine there are three candidates. You can:

1 Vote for just one candidate

Just put a number 1 next to the name of that candidate.

- SMITH, John
- 1 DOE, Jane
- CITIZEN, Neville

2 Vote for some

Just put a 1 next to the name of the candidate you like best and a 2 next to your second choice.

- SMITH, John
- 1 DOE, Jane
- 2 CITIZEN, Neville

3 Vote for all

Put a 1 in the box for the candidate you like best and then a 2 for your second choice and a 3 for your third choice. If there are more candidates you just keep numbering if you want.

- 3 SMITH, John
- 1 DOE, Jane
- 2 CITIZEN, Neville

Birds on Farms

For the farmers

Most of us would be aware of birds we see from time to time around the farm, but do you know what species you have on your land? Any important habitat? Nesting sites?



Birdlife WA is keen to answer those questions across Wheatbelt farms. Nationally the numbers of woodland birds are decreasing and many of those species are found in agricultural regions, so Birdlife Australia has started a program to try to get a true idea of our local bird populations.



We are working with Birdlife WA to find farms where birdwatching surveys can be undertaken regularly across several years. You don't have to be a 'birdo' to get involved, land owners are encouraged to take part, but if you can't, we can source dedicated birdwatchers to survey your farm and provide you with the data.

For the bird enthusiasts

As part of the program, we are also seeking volunteers who would like to get involved in surveying. We invite community members, whether you are experienced bird watchers or not, to come along to our Birds on Farms workshop to learn how to undertake surveys and get involved in updating national records for our woodland bird species.

We are hosting a Birds on Farms workshop in our office Sat, 16th Sept which will cover the birds on farms program and follow on with a site visit where we go through the process of a survey and how to fill out the data.



There will also be 3 webinars available which you can register for to accompany the program.

You can register your interest with Gen at the office for either a birdwatching role or a farm location (or both!) and be sure to keep an eye out for updates on the webinar series and event coming on the 16th Sept

Carbon Farming Information Session



Most of us have heard of 'carbon farming' over the last few years but up until now there hasn't been a blue print for how to go about it.

We hosted a workshop in Woodanilling on 27th June 2023 where the DPIRD Carbon Futures team came and provided some detailed information for landholders on how carbon farming is structured and the steps needed to get involved.

There is terminology like off-setting for emissions, in-setting on farm to achieve carbon neutral status, ACCU's (Australian Carbon Credit Units), carbon accounting and a whole range of jargon.

To be eligible for a carbon farming project, your activity must be NEW to your current daily operation, for example you can't use soil carbon sequestration from perennial pastures you have been utilising for years, however if you wish to change practices to include perennials, this may be an option for you. Carbon farming does include trees, both biodiverse and plantation, but it is also about soil carbon.

You will need to undertake a land management strategy. This document is to register with the Clean Energy Regulator (CER), work out the activities, what they will cost, what risks and how it will be maintained for minimum 25 years, identify your carbon estimation areas and account for your emissions from your farm business. The DPIRD staff are on hand to assist you with this step.

There are a number of things a landowner needs to do to get involved and this is what the Carbon Futures team at DPIRD are created to do.




