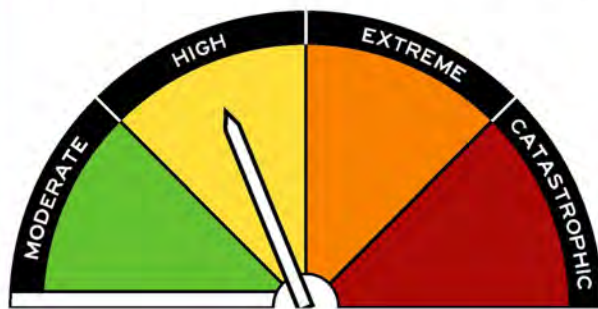

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System

COMING SEPTEMBER 1



The Australian Fire Danger Ratings (AFDRS) levels are:



MODERATE

Plan and prepare

HIGH

Be ready to act

EXTREME

Take action now to protect life and property

CATASTROPHIC

For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas

The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index – a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams. The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology. A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.

SHIRE OF WOODANILLING 2022/2023 BUDGET ADOPTED

At the Special Council Meeting held on 30 August 2022, Council adopted the 2022/2023 annual financial budget.

The 2022/2023 budget continues to focus on addressing maintenance of core infrastructure, but also looks at work with the support of the Local Roads and Infrastructure grants program in the areas of community and roads programs.

Shire President Cr Stephen Jefferies noted "This is a budget that Council fully supports. There will have be a rates increase of 7% as the Shire is not immune to the increasing cost of utilities, fuel, building supplies and materials and many other goods and services, all of which resulted in Council supporting this increase."

"The increase is not what we had hoped for but with rising costs in the current environment, we felt that there was minimal to cut out of the budget without the reduction of service delivery to the district."

"Our road network has had the increase due to harvest season and record crops bringing an increase in heavy vehicle use, along with at times, a longer season. With more activity on rural roads, we are trying to maintain these roads and seeking more additional funding where we can."

The 2022/2023 budget reflects:

- \$25,000 new Basketball Court at Centenary Park;
- \$12,000 additional CCTV and street lighting;
- \$25,000 for improvements to walking trails;
- \$16,000 for improvements and signage at Lake Queerearup;
- \$143,000 for Town Dam Works with DWER for the Community Water Grants;
- \$25,000 for replacement of the Men's Shed Roof;
- \$15,000 replacement of Kenmare Hall roof;
- Improvements to shire facilities and housing; and
- Purchase of new Grader.

Major road works this year include Robinson Road West and East, Oxley, Cornwall, Onslow, Orchard, Newstead, Burt, Orchard and Douglas Roads. Bridge works will take place on Carrolup River and Bellakin Brook Bridges, as well as our ongoing summer and winter grades, re sheeting and sealing works across the road network of the Shire. The Shire anticipates spending \$1,741,245 on a capital works program over the 2022/2023 financial year.

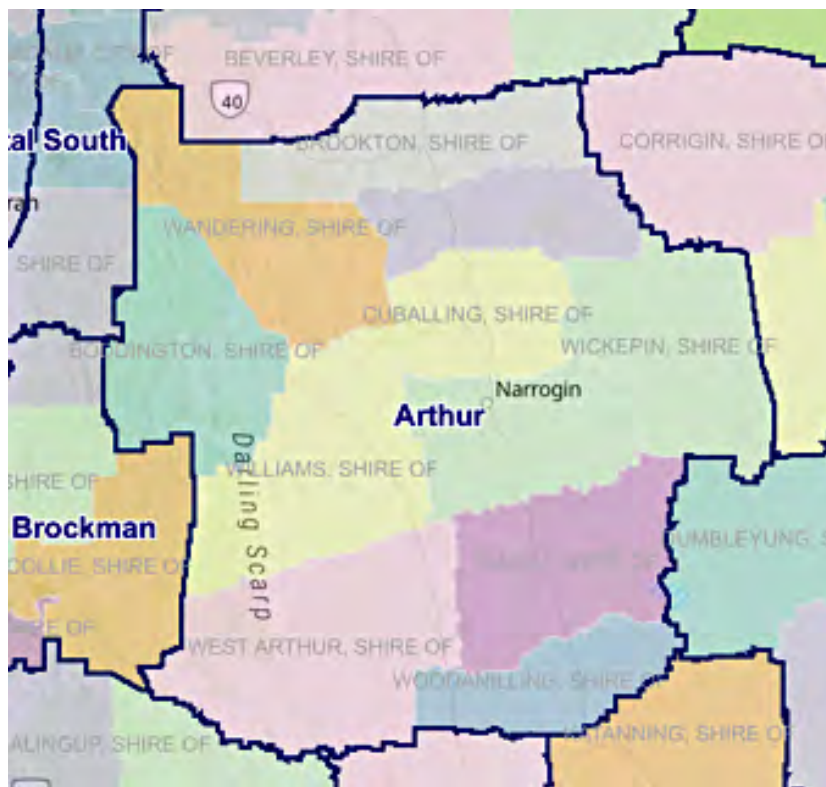

Under the new changes the "Arthur Fire Weather District" will give Woodanilling a better fire weather forecast.

is a Weed Of National Significance (WONS)

Why Is Boneseed A Problem?

Boneseed is one of the worst weeds in Australia because of its environmental impacts, invasive ability, and serious potential to spread. Boneseed, a South African shrub, was introduced to Australia as a garden plant in the late 1800s. This fast growing, aggressive plant has no natural enemies in Australia, and it has spread from gardens to become a damaging environmental weed.



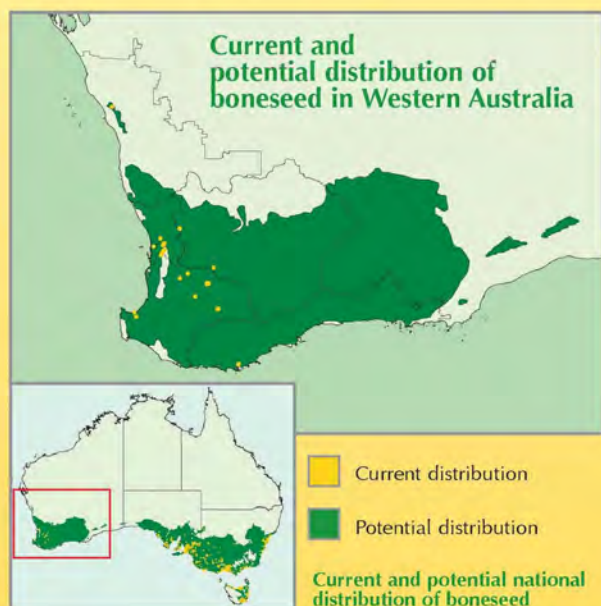
Boneseed invades native bushland and forms dense thickets that smother native plants and prevent regeneration. In Western Australia, boneseed has the potential to endanger threatened plants and ecological communities throughout the Southwest and surrounding regions. Boneseed:

- invades forests, woodlands, shrublands, dunes, coastal areas, heathlands, riparian areas, sclerophyll forest and mallee
- grows in most soil types and tolerates a wide range of climates
- rapidly colonises after disturbance such as clearing or burning
- alters habitat and displaces food plants of native birds and animals
- replaces native nectar plants important to bee-keepers, and
- can restrict access to beaches, parks, and trails.

Where Is It And How Does It Spread?

Boneseed is a serious weed in South Australia, Tasmania and Victoria. If not controlled, boneseed has the potential to spread throughout southwest Western Australia (see map). Several small infestations around Perth and in the southwest are under eradication.

Boneseed reproduces by seeds that are spread into bushland by birds, rabbits, foxes, emus, livestock and other animals. Seeds can also spread via fresh or salt water, in soil or dumped garden waste, and on vehicles and equipment. Plants can produce enormous amounts of seed (up to 50,000 seeds per plant!) that germinate readily.
