The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index – a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams.

The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology.

A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.

BARKING DOGS, DOGS NOT CONTAINED IN THEIR YARDS, CATS WANDERING AROUND THE STREETS.

Complaints have been coming in recently from the community in regards to the above headings.

Council promotes responsible dog and cat ownership. Dog owners need to ensure their dog/s do not become a neighbourhood nuisance by barking. Barking is a dogs natural means of communication and often signifies its alertness to danger or intruders. However, a dog that persistently barks to a degree or extent not normally habitual in dogs, constitutes a nuisance. For the purpose of Section 38 of the Dog Act 1976 a dog shall be taken to be a nuisance if the dog:

"makes a noise, by barking or otherwise, that persistently occurs or continues to such a degree or extent that it unreasonably interferes with the peace, comfort or convenience of any person in any place"

The Cat Act 2011 requires the identification, registration and sterilisation of domestic cats, and gives local governments the power to administer and enforce the legislation. The legislation, which took full effect in November 2013, provides for better management of the unwanted impacts of cats on the community and the environment, and encourages responsible cat ownership. Local governments enforce and administer the Cat Act. This is a reminder to Cat owners to make sure they are being responsible and adhering to the Cat Act.

If you would like further information regarding your requirements as an owner of a Dog or a Cat in the Shire of Woodanilling please don't hesitate to contact the Shire.

APPLY FOR PENSIONER RATES CONCESSIONS

Eligible pensioners or seniors may qualify for a concession from Council rates and the Emergency Services Levy and in some circumstances, to rubbish service charges. For the 2021/22 financial year, the pensioner rates capped amount is remaining at \$750. Seniors will have their rebates capped at a maximum amount of \$100.

To register for a concession, please visit the Water Corporation's rates concession page. This application will register you with the Water Corporation and the Shire of Woodanilling via the one form. Once it is approved by the Water Corporation it will be forwarded to the Shire of Woodanilling to process on the rates account.

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Dear parents/carers and community members,

It is hard to believe it is only Week Four. We have all been working away busily in the classroom; sorting library books; caring for the grounds; in the office and keeping our school clean. We have developed a cohesive team this year and we are all enjoying working together to meet our school vision.

> Woodanilling Primary School is committed to achieving high quality education, whereby students develop the knowledge, skills and confidence to achieve their individual goals and contribute to society.

Whilst we have a wonderful team, it is time to say goodbye and 'Thank You' to Tracey Kippin as she finishes her contract and will be busy with many things in her home life. Tracey has been amazing, both last year and this year, returning to the role of Manager of Corporate Services (MCS) and helping new staff to understand whole school processes. She will be deeply missed by all.

The MCS advertising closed on Tuesday and interviews will be held on Monday 27th February. The panel will meet, and we hope we can find someone suitable to fill the role and continue to see our school finances and administration operating at a high level.

I am also in the process of working with a

selection

panel to recruit a new Early Childhood teacher for our classroom and interviews will also be held on Monday 27th February. It will be exciting to introduce a new teacher to our school and our marvellous children. I must commend Ms Haber for the amazing work she has completed in the classroom and the way she has worked to build confidence of the students and challenge their learning. I will keep you updated about the outcome.

I have been working with the pre-primary students to complete the On-Entry assessments and it is great to see their initial learning and understandings in literacy and numeracy. Once completed reports will go home to parents. Another assessment that will soon be ready for our Year Three students is the NAPLAN. I am preparing the online platform in readiness and students will soon be about to complete some practice tests so they will be wellprepared to demonstrate their knowledge and understandings. With NAPLAN moved into Term One the information about the students will be returned earlier in the year to support our planning and teaching.

At the start of the year, we invited Jamie Mawer from Behaviour and Engagement to run a WA Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) training day. Staff investigated the PBS process and the research behind a positive teaching and explored the needs based on the context of our school and decided to go ahead with the program that is a Wheatbelt regional initiative. A purpose statement underpins how the team operates and at our last staff meeting we collaboratively developed the following statement:

The purpose of the PBS team is to develop and implement School-wide Positive Behaviour Support in order to achieve higher educational outcomes through enhanced behaviour in a safe and supportive environment. It is our intention that this will develop a school culture which is positive and consistent, and based on a common language which is used by all.

We'll keep you updated about the progress we make toward developing the program and the behaviour matrix that underpins it.

I've been working together with Kahlia Stephens, the Department of Education and Playgroup WA to investigate the possibility of Woodanilling Playgroup continuing to meet at the school. I will keep you informed of our progress in the next newsletter.

FROM THE CLASSROOM

What a fabulous Week 4 we have had at Woody! The students earned their first Reward Day by filling the marble jar. Our young people are acknowledged for positive behaviours, such as organising themselves for class in the morning, taking responsibility for doing their jobs, showing kindness by helping and supporting each other and for good listening (the 5 L's - ask your child to explain!), focus and effort in class.

All students have contributed to the reward jar and voted for their top choice of reward - a glow stick dance party! It was wonderful. Great music requests from the students - Lady Gaga was a popular choice, Meghan Traynor for the girls, as well as country soft rock from A Star Is Born and a bit of hip hop and all the moves that went with it. Boy did we dance up a storm! The students dressed up beautifully for the event and shared their glow sticks with generous spirit.

We also completed our second Art project on Pop Art and the students produced some wonderfully rich and colourful art works featuring every day objects, such as Coca-Cola cans.

For Literacy, the little Woodies have been talking, reading and writing about dogs - *Bluey* and the picture book, *Mutt Dog* have been stimuli for discussion and word play.

In Maths, number skills are the focus for all students P-4, with the younger students working on reading, writing and saying their numbers and counting skills, and the older students developing place value concepts into the 10 000's.

For Literacy, Years 3 and 4 are being challenged to use reading strategies to assist them with comprehension and finding answers to comprehension questions with greater accuracy. Ask your child what these strategies are - skim reading, identifying key words in questions, scanning the text, understanding different types of questions, such as 'summary' and 'author's purpose'. This is very new to the students and so

don't expect this to be understood just yet. Key boarding practice has been enjoyed by the older students this week and touch typing skills are already developing.

Self-compassion for children: 3-8 years Self-compassion: what is it?

Self-compassion is **being kind to yourself** even when things don't happen the way you expect. It's being aware of your feelings and treating yourself with the same warmth, care and understanding you'd give to someone you care about.

It's also acknowledging that struggles and challenges are a part of life and that everyone goes through them. **Self-**

compassion: why it's good for children Self-

compassion helps children deal with failures, mistakes, setbacks and tough times in a healthy way.

For example, if your child comes last in a race, they might feel disappointed. But self-compassion helps your child feel OK and handle their disappointment positively. Your child might say to themselves, 'I feel disappointed, but I'm glad I tried my best' or 'I'll try again next time'.

When children learn to treat themselves with self-compassion, they:

are happier

have more confidence and self-esteem

are more likely to try new things or try again
when things don't work out the first time

have more resilience, so they can 'bounce back' during or after difficult times.

Self-compassion helps children do well at school and develop new skills in areas like sport, music, dance and so on. Children with self-compassion also tend to get along with others and are more likely to help other children.

They're also less likely to develop mental health problems like depression or anxiety.

History Of Woodanilling

Woodanilling was named after a spring in the Boyerine Creek one kilometre south of the townsite. This spring, situated among the Casuarinas and flooded gums, used to flow into a beautiful pool which became a gathering place for the districts new settlers and became known as Round Pool. The Woodanilling District was first explored by Europeans in 1830/31, when Captain Thomas Bannister led the first overland expedition from Perth to King George III Sound.

Further exploration of the area was undertaken in 1843 by Henry Landor and Henry Maxwell Lefroy while searching for a large inland sea said to exist south east of York. The lake they found, with the help of Aboriginal guides, is approximately 40 kilometers north east of Woodanilling and was called Dambeling by the Aborigines. This was later changed to Dumbleyung by early European Settlers.


The construction of the Perth/Albany Road in the early 1850's brought the fine grazing lands in this region to the attention of many pastoralists, who took up leases while retaining their permanent properties at places like York. The Woodanilling area was also a rich source of sandalwood and for many early settlers it was a valuable source of income while they were establishing their homesteads.

One of the first to graze sheep in the area was Elijah Quartermaine around 1850/51.

Woodanilling was among the many districts to benefit from the opening of the Great Southern Railway in 1889. The Woodanilling townsite was gazetted in 1892. The Woodanilling Road Board was formed in 1906 and had an average population of 800. Around this time Woodanilling could boast a Blacksmith, Wheelwright, 5 General Stores, Post Office, Banks, Hotel, Hospital, School, Bakery, Church, Barbers, Boarding House, Saddlery Shop, Railway Station, and the first trotting track outside the Perth Metropolitan area.



1 x Onion chopped

3 x Celery Stalks chopped

1 x red capsicum chopped

1 x Zucchini grated

1 x tinned tomatoes

1 x tinned kidney beans

1 x tin Heinz tomato soup

1 x cup of beef stock



Method



Gently fry first four ingredients until soft. Add remaining ingredients and simmer for half an hour. Pasta or rice can be added if desired.

St. Patrick's Day Recipe 1

Ingredients
1 cup self-raising flour
3/4 cup caster sugar
2 tbsp cocoa sifted
1/2 cup desiccated coconut
125g butter melted
1 egg
3 Nestle Peppermint Crisp
chocolate bars

Icing Ingredients
11/2 cups icing sugar
2 tbsp cocoa
1 tbsp butter melted
2 tbsp boiling water
1 tsp peppermint essence



Step 1

Preheat oven to 200C (180C fan-forced). Line a square cake tin with baking paper. In a large bowl, combine flour, sugar, cocoa and coconut. Whisk egg into melted butter, then combine this well with dry ingredients.

Step 2

Press mixture evenly into prepared tin and smooth the top with the back of a large spoon. Bake for 20 minutes.

Step 3

Meanwhile make icing by sifting icing sugar and cocoa into a bowl. Add melted butter, boiling water and peppermint essence, and stir until smooth. Pour over baked base while it's still a little warm.

Step 4

Roughly chop Peppermint Crisp bars. Sprinkle over icing. Refrigerate to set. Slice into small bars or squares.

Recipe 2



Ingredients

2 kg chuck beef steak, diced

3 onion sliced

4 garlic clove crushed

1 tbs oil

1 egg beaten

2/3 cup plain flour 400 ml Guinness

2 cups Beef Style Liquid

Stocl

2 sheets ready rolled

puff pastry

Step 1

Brown steak in hot oil. Set aside.

Step 2

In a frypan, cook onions and garlic in oil until golden.

Step 3

Sprinkle in flour and cook for 1 minute then return meat and juices to pan, add Guinness and stock.

Bring to the boil. Reduce heat, simmer for 2 hours until tender and sauce has thickened.

Step 4

Preheat oven to 200C. Spoon beef mixture into eight 250 mL ovenproof ramekins.

Cut out eight circles of pastry to cover. Press firmly onto dishes and seal.

Brush with egg, place on a tray and bake for 25 minutes until golden.
