#### BRIEF SUMMARY

Consideration of an application for a relocated dwelling / transportable at Lot 260 (#2) Venn Road.

#### BACKGROUND

The subject land is Lot 260 DP223225 Venn Road which has an area of 4,040sqm. The site is located on the northern side of Venn Road with a frontage of 40m and the eastern boundary fronts Monger Road.

The application is to develop a residence being a prefabricated 1 bedroom (Cavalier) transportable dwelling. It is 12m by 4.8m and has an additional low sloping skillion roof over the top of the existing building. It will be setback 30m from the front boundary, 15m from the western boundary and 20m from the eastern (Monger Road) boundary.

It is a second hand building originally manufactured in 1996 and photographs of the building are included in Attachment 1. The applicant has indicated that it will take approximately 18months to complete and that the exterior it will be painted and decorated in a heritage blue style colour scheme.

The subject land is cleared grassland with some trees planted around the boundaries. The immediately adjacent lots to the north and west are vacant.

#### STATUTORY/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

##### Town Planning Scheme No 1

The subject land is zoned Residential R5 and the minimum setbacks are 12m from the front boundary, 6m from the secondary street and 6m from the rear boundary.

Clause 5.8 of the Scheme relates to Relocated Residential Buildings and states that a building may not be placed on a lot and occupied as a dwelling following transportation as a whole or as parts of a building unless in the opinion of the Council, such a building is in a satisfactory condition and will not detrimentally affect the amenity of the area; or the building has been specifically constructed as a transportable dwelling.

Clause 5.8 of the Scheme relates to the General Appearance of Buildings and states that no person shall without written approval of the council erect a building which by virtue of colour or type of materials, architectural style, height or bulk, ornamental or general appearance, has an exterior design which is out of harmony with existing buildings or the landscape character of the area.

Development in the Residential zone is also subject to the Residential Design Codes (R Codes). Clause 6.2.4 of the Code relates to Building Appearance where the Council has identified the need for design controls as reflected in a local planning policy or the provisions of the scheme.

##### Bushfire Prone Land

All of the subject land has been designated as being bushfire prone. Under the Local Planning Scheme Regulations, any structure on bushfire prone land used by people for living or working, is required to have a Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) Assessment undertaken.

A BAL Assessment has been conducted by an accredited bushfire practitioner and the development site has a BAL-12.5 rating.

**COMMENT**

The proposed building is specifically designed to be transported and will be placed as a permanent residence. It is very small being only 57.6sqm but there are other single bedroom dwellings within the townsite. Single bedroom dwellings are recognised as an affordable means of accommodation and preferable to landowners attempting to reside in sheds or caravans.

The dwelling will need to comply with all the current building regulations the same as any new dwelling including energy efficiency, access, ceiling heights and bushfire construction measures.

The principal issue is whether the building will have an unacceptable impact on the character of the area. In its current configuration it may look out of place on the property which is also due to it being located in the centre of the lot with no other infrastructure or landscaping. The general appearance of the building can be improved by the addition of pergolas or a veranda, but the applicant has not indicated if this will be happening. It can also be improved by painting and landscape planting.

The character of the surrounding area is variable both in terms of the standard of the housing and the general appearance of the properties with sheds and other material. Consequently, it is not possible to definitely argue that the proposed development will be out of character as this will largely depend on the final development and maintenance of the property.

That Council approve the use and development of Lot 260 DP223225 (#2) Venn Road for the purpose of a dwelling subject to the following conditions.

1. The development hereby approved shall occur generally in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted with the application and these shall not be altered or modified without the prior written approval of the Council.
2. Any use, additions to and further intensification of any part of the building or land (not the subject of this consent) shall be subject to a further development application and consent for that use.
3. The site shall be so ordered and maintained as not to prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of appearance.
4. No polluted drainage shall be discharged beyond the boundaries of the land from which it emanates or into watercourse or easement drain, but shall be so treated and/or absorbed on that lot to the satisfaction of the Environmental Health Officer.
5. This approval shall expire if the development hereby permitted is not completed within two years of the date hereof, or within any extension of that time which, upon written application (made before or within 21 days after the expiry of the approval) to the Council, is granted by it in writing.

### BRIEF SUMMARY

Local Governments without Waste Local Laws use their Health Local Laws, based on the *Health Act 1911* to regulate waste services, as per the transition arrangements in the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery (WARR) Act 2007*.

### BACKGROUND

The use of Health Local Laws or provisions in local laws to regulate waste services does not provide accurate guidance and regulation for the implementation of best practice waste management to achieve a healthy community and protect the environment. Health Local Laws can be outdated and not suitable, containing archaic terminology. More recently the importance of Waste Local Laws will be realised with the commencement of the Container Deposit Scheme in July 2020. This local law will provide legal protection for residents and local government and their valuable eligible containers.

A Waste Local Law under section 61 of the WARR Act 2007 provides local governments with the power to perform its functions under the WARR Act. Waste Local Laws cover the setting of fees and charges for waste services; the use, control and type of receptacles to be used; and define collectable, non-collectable and recycling waste. They also outline the duties of owners and occupiers. A Waste Local Law will provide an option for enforcement in instances where ongoing contamination is occurring despite multiple notifications of disposal requirements, or where receptacles are causing a nuisance. The introduction of a Waste Local Law also provides provisions for collection of a wider range of Local Government waste, in line with the Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery (WARR) Strategy 2030. There is also a provision for the Local Government to make a 'determination' under their Local Law for a different range of services, should they be introduced in the future. Under this legislation local governments will be more supported in decision making, with waste education and regulation/infringement services having a common reference across Shires to offer consistency.

The West Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) is encouraging all councils to introduce a Waste Local Law. Most metropolitan councils have introduced Waste Local Laws, but many regional councils are yet to follow their lead. WALGA has provided a Waste Local Law model template and guidance notes, which assist in ensuring laws are legally robust and meet the expectations of the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation.

**COMMENT**

Council's endorsement is sought to commence the process of introducing a Waste Local Law for the Shire of Williams. The Shire is also asked to support a collaborative approach with other shires in the 4WDL VROC. The Shire of Williams offers to oversee the process of adopting the local law by all VROC members. As the central point of contact the Shire of Williams can assist with common Agenda items and facilitate the coordinated process and timeframe. Waste Local Laws will contain location specific lists of recyclables. The Laws will also entail individual amendments to existing local laws, involving the repeal of items related to waste, to ensure similar matters are not within two local laws. Each shire will appoint an officer to supply individual information and approve drafts.

Guidance will also be sought from Mr Niel Mitchell – Conway Highbury Pty Ltd to oversee the development of a Waste Local Law that can be used as a common text by the members of the 4WDL VROC. Mr Mitchell has extensive experience with Local Government local laws, and is currently engaged by the Shire of Narrogin as a Governance Consultant and has commence their Waste Local Law formal process.

It is recommended that this strategic partnership be considered and if it is mutually beneficial the Shire of Williams in collaboration with Mr Niel Mitchell can be tasked to commence the process on behalf of the 4WDL local governments.

**Waste Local Law 2019**

Under the powers conferred on it by the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Act 2007*, the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other enabling powers, the Council of the Shire of Woodanilling resolved on [insert date] to make the following local law.

**Part 1 - Preliminary**

**1.1 Short title**

This is the Shire of Woodanilling Waste Local Law 2019

**1.2 Commencement**

This local law commences 14 days after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

**1.3 Application**

This local law applies throughout the district.

**1.4 Repeal**

[**Insert name of local law, or part of local law, to be repealed**], published in the *Government Gazette* on [insert date], is repealed.

**1.5 Meaning of terms used in this local law**

(1) In this local law—

**authorised person** means a person appointed by the local government under section 9.10 of the LG Act to perform any of the functions of an authorised person under this local law;

**collectable waste** means local government waste that is not—

- (a) liquid refuse;
- (b) liquid waste; or
- (c) non-collectable waste;

**collectable waste receptacle** means a receptacle for the deposit and collection of collectable waste that is—

- (a) a recycling waste receptacle;
- (b) a general waste receptacle; or
- (c) an organic waste receptacle;

**collection**, when used in relation to a receptacle, means the collection and removal of collectable waste from the receptacle by the local government or its contractor;

**collection day** means the day determined by the local government for the collection of collectable waste in the district or a part of the district;

**collection time** means the time on the collection day determined by the local government for the collection of collectable waste in the district or a part of the district;

**costs** of the local government include administrative costs;

**Council** means the council of the local government;

**district** means the district of the local government;

**general waste receptacle** means a receptacle for the deposit and collection of collectable waste that is not recycling waste;

**LG Act** means the *Local Government Act 1995*;

**LG Regulations** means the *Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996*;

**local government** means Shire of Woodanilling.

**local government waste** has the same meaning as in the WARR Act;

**non-collectable waste** has the meaning set out in Schedule 1;

**occupier** in relation to premises, means any or all of the following—

- (a) a person by whom or on whose behalf the premises are actually occupied; or
- (b) a person having the management or control of the premises;

**organic waste** means waste that decomposes readily, such as garden waste or food waste;

**organic waste receptacle** means a receptacle for the deposit and collection of organic waste ;

**owner** has the same meaning as in the LG Act;

**public place** includes a place to which the public ordinarily have access, whether or not by payment of a fee;

**receptacle**, means a receptacle—

- (a) that has been supplied for the use of the premises by the local government or its contractor, or which has otherwise been approved by the local government; and
- (b) the waste from which is collected and removed from the premises by the local government or its contractor;

**recycling waste receptacle** means a receptacle for the deposit and collection of recycling waste;

**recycling waste** means—

- (a) paper and cardboard;
- (b) plastic containers comprised of polyethylene terephthalate or high density polyethylene;
- (c) glass containers;
- (d) steel containers;
- (e) aluminium containers;
- (f) liquid paper board; and
- (g) any other waste determined by the local government to be recycling waste;

**specified** means specified by the local government or an authorised person, as the case may be;

**street alignment** means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts the street;

**WARR Act** means the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Act 2007*;

**WARR Regulations** means the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Regulations 2008*;

**waste** has the same meaning as in the WARR Act;

**waste facility** means a waste facility, as defined in the WARR Act, that is operated by the local government; and

**waste service** has the same meaning as in the WARR Act.

- (2) Where, in this local law, a duty or liability is imposed on an owner or occupier, or on an owner and occupier, the duty or liability is taken to be imposed jointly and severally on each of the owners or occupiers.

## 1.6 Local public notice of determinations

Where, under this local law, the local government has a power to determine a matter –



- (a) local public notice, under section 1.7 of the LG Act, must be given of the matter determined;
- (b) the determination becomes effective only after local public notice has been given;
- (c) the determination remains in force for the period of one year after the date that local public notice has been given under subclause (a);
- (d) after the period referred to in subclause (c), the determination continues in force only if, and for so long as, it is the subject of local public notice, given annually, under section 1.7 of the LG Act; and
- (e) the determination must be recorded in a publicly accessible register of determinations that must be maintained by the local government.

### **1.7 Rates, fees and charges**

The local government's powers to impose rates, fees and charges in relation to waste services are set out in sections 66 to 68 of the WARR Act and sections 6.16 and 6.17 of the LG Act.

### **1.8 Power to provide waste services**

The local government's power to provide, or enter into a contract for the provision of, waste services is dealt with in section 50 of the WARR Act.

## **Part 2 - Local government waste**

### **2.1 Supply of receptacles**

- (1) The local government is to supply, for the use of each premises that are, or are capable of being, occupied or used for residential purposes, one or more receptacles for the collection and removal, from those premises, of collectable waste.
- (2) The owner of premises to which subclause (1) applies must—
  - (a) ensure that the fee or charge (if any) imposed by the local government in relation to each receptacle is paid to the local government; and
  - (b) ensure that each receptacle is used, in respect of those premises, in accordance with this local law.

### **2.2 Deposit of waste in receptacles**

- (1) An owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in a receptacle any non-collectable waste.
- (2) A person must not deposit waste in a receptacle that has been provided for the use of other premises without the consent of the owner or occupier of those premises.

### **2.3 General waste receptacles**

- (1) An owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in a general waste receptacle—
  - (a) where the receptacle has a capacity of 240 litres—more than 70 kilograms of collectable waste; or
  - (b) where the receptacle has any other capacity—more than the weight determined by the local government.
- (2) Where the local government supplies recycling waste receptacles, an owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in a general waste receptacle any recycling waste.
- (3) Where the local government supplies organic waste receptacles, an owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in a general waste receptacle any organic waste.

### **2.4 Recycling waste receptacles**

An owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in a recycling waste receptacle—

- (a) anything other than the particular type of recycling waste for which that receptacle was provided by the local government for those premises;
- (b) where the receptacle has a capacity of 240 litres— more than 70 kilograms of recycling waste; or
- (c) where the receptacle has any other capacity—more than the weight determined by the local government.

### **2.5 Organic waste receptacles**

An owner or occupier of premises must not deposit or permit to be deposited in an organic waste receptacle—

- (a) anything other than the particular type of organic waste for which that receptacle was provided by the local government for those premises;
- (b) where the receptacle has a capacity of 240 litres - more than 70 kilograms of organic waste; or
- (c) where the receptacle has any other capacity - more than the weight determined by the local government.

### **2.6 Direction to place or remove a receptacle**

- (1) The local government or an authorised person may give a written direction to an owner or occupier of specified premises —
  - (a) to place a receptacle in respect of those premises for collection; or
  - (b) to remove a receptacle in respect of those premises after collection.

- (2) The direction under subclause (1) may specify when the placement or removal is to occur, or where the receptacle is to be placed, or both.
- (3) An owner or occupier of premises must comply with a direction given under this clause.

## **2.7 Duties of owner or occupier**

An owner or occupier of premises must—

- (a) except for a reasonable period before and after collection time, keep each receptacle in a storage space or area that is behind the street alignment;
- (b) take reasonable steps, if placing a receptacle for collection on the verge adjoining the premises, or other area as determined by the local government, ensure that, within a reasonable period before collection time, each receptacle is —
  - (i) within 1 metre of the carriageway;
  - (ii) placed so that it does not unduly obstruct any footpath, cycle way, right-of-way or carriageway; and
  - (iii) facing squarely to the edge of and opening towards the carriageway,or in such other position as is approved in writing by the local government or an authorised person;
- (c) take reasonable steps to ensure that the premises are provided with an adequate number of receptacles; and
- (d) if the receptacle is lost, stolen, damaged or defective, notify the local government, as soon as practicable, after the event.

## **2.8 Exemption**

- (1) An owner or occupier of premises may apply in writing to the local government for an exemption from compliance with the requirements of clause 2.7(a) or (b).
- (2) The local government or an authorised person may grant, with or without conditions, or refuse an application for exemption from compliance under this clause.
- (3) An exemption granted under this clause must state—
  - (a) the premises to which the exemption applies;
  - (b) the period during which the exemption applies; and
  - (c) any conditions imposed by the local government or the authorised person.
- (4) An exemption granted under this clause ceases to apply –

- (a) if the local government decides, on reasonable grounds, that there has been a failure to comply with a condition of the exemption; and
- (b) from the date that the local government informs the owner or occupier of its decision under clause 2.8(4)(a).

## **2.9 Damaging or removing receptacles**

A person, other than the local government or its contractor, must not—

- (a) damage, destroy or interfere with a receptacle; or
- (b) except as permitted by this local law or as authorised by the local government or an authorised person, remove a receptacle from any premises to which it was delivered by the local government or its contractor.

## **2.10 Verge collections**

- (1) Where the local government has advertised a verge waste collection (such as a green waste, or a bulk waste, verge collection) a person, unless with and in accordance with the approval of the local government or an authorised person—
  - (a) must deposit waste only during the period of time, and in accordance with other terms and conditions, as advertised by the local government in relation to that verge waste collection; and
  - (b) must otherwise comply with those terms and conditions.
- (2) Where waste has been deposited on a verge for a verge waste collection, a person must not remove any of that waste for a commercial purpose but may remove it for any other purpose.
- (3) Except where waste is lawfully removed from a verge under this clause, a person must not disassemble or tamper with any waste deposited on a verge for a verge waste collection so as to increase the risk of harm to any person.
- (4) Clause 2.10(2) does not apply to the local government or a person engaged or contracted by the local government in relation to the verge waste collection.

## **Part 3 - General duties**

### **3.1 Duties of an owner or occupier**

An owner or occupier of premises must—

- (a) take reasonable steps to ensure that a sufficient number of receptacles are provided to contain all waste which accumulates or may accumulate in or from the premises;
- (b) ensure that each receptacle is kept in good condition and repair;
- (c) take all reasonable steps to—

- (i) prevent fly breeding and keep each receptacle free of flies, maggots, cockroaches, rodents and other vectors of disease;
  - (ii) prevent the emission of offensive or noxious odours from each receptacle; and
  - (iii) ensure that each receptacle does not cause a nuisance to an occupier of adjoining premises; and
- (d) whenever directed to do so by the local government or an authorised person, thoroughly clean, disinfect, deodorise and apply a residual insecticide to each receptacle.

### **3.2 Removal of waste from premises**

- (1) A person must not remove any waste from premises unless that person is—
- (a) the owner or occupier of the premises;
  - (b) authorised to do so by the owner or occupier of the premises; or
  - (c) authorised in writing to do so by the local government or an authorised person.
- (2) A person must not remove any waste from a receptacle without the approval of –
- (a) the local government or an authorised person; or
  - (b) the owner or occupier of the premises at which the receptacle is ordinarily kept.

### **3.3 Receptacles and containers for public use**

A person must not, without the approval of the local government or an authorised person—

- (a) deposit household, commercial or other waste from any premises on or into; or
- (b) remove any waste from,

a receptacle provided for the use of the general public in a public place.

## **Part 4 - Operation of waste facilities**

### **4.1 Operation of this Part**

This Part applies to a person who enters a waste facility.

### **4.2 Hours of operation**

The local government may from time to time determine the hours of operation of a waste facility.

#### **4.3 Signs and directions**

- (1) The local government or an authorised person may regulate the use of a waste facility—
  - (a) by means of a sign; or
  - (b) by giving a direction to a person within a waste facility.
- (2) A person within a waste facility must comply with a sign or direction under subclause (1).
- (3) The local government or an authorised person may direct a person who commits, or is reasonably suspected by the local government or the authorised person of having committed, an offence under this clause to leave the waste facility immediately.
- (4) A person must comply with a direction under subclause (3).

#### **4.4 Fees and charges**

- (1) Unless subclause (3) applies, a person must, on or before entering a waste facility or on demand by the local government or an authorised person, pay the fee or charge as assessed by an authorised person.
- (2) An authorised person may assess the fee or charge in respect of a particular load of waste at a rate that applies to any part of that load, even if that rate is higher than the rate that would apply to any other part of the load.
- (3) Subclause (1) does not apply—
  - (a) to a person who disposes of waste in accordance with the terms of—
    - (i) a credit arrangement with the local government; or
    - (ii) any other arrangement with the local government to pay the fee or charge at a different time or in a different manner; and
  - (b) to the deposit of waste owned by the local government, or in the possession of an employee on behalf of the local government.

#### **4.5 Depositing waste**

- (1) A person must not deposit waste at a waste facility other than—
  - (a) at a location determined by a sign and in accordance with the sign; and
  - (b) in accordance with the direction of an authorised person.
- (2) The local government may determine the classification of any waste that may be deposited at a waste facility.

#### **4.6 Prohibited activities**

- (1) Unless authorised by the local government, a person must not—

- (a) remove any waste or any other thing from a waste facility;
  - (b) deposit at a waste facility that is a landfill site any waste that is toxic, poisonous or hazardous, or the depositing of which is regulated or prohibited by any written law;
  - (c) light a fire in a waste facility;
  - (d) remove, damage or otherwise interfere with any flora in a waste facility;
  - (e) remove, injure or otherwise interfere with any fauna in a waste facility; or
  - (f) damage, deface or destroy any building, equipment, plant or property within a waste facility.
- (2) A person must not act in an abusive or threatening manner towards any person using, or engaged in the management or operation of, a waste facility.

## **Part 5 - Enforcement**

### **5.1 Objection and appeal rights**

Division 1 of Part 9 of the LG Act applies to a decision under this local law to grant, renew, vary or cancel –

- (a) an approval under clause 2.7(b);
- (b) an exemption under clause 2.8(2);
- (c) an approval under clause 2.9(b);
- (d) an approval under clause 2.10(1);
- (e) an authorisation under clause 3.2(1)(c);
- (f) an approval under clause 3.2(2); and
- (g) an approval under clause 3.3.

### **5.2 Offences and general penalty**

- (1) A person who fails to do anything required or directed to be done under this local law, or who does anything which under this local law a person is prohibited from doing, commits an offence.
- (2) A person who commits an offence under this local law is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$5,000, and if the offence is of a continuing nature, to a further penalty not exceeding \$500 in respect of each day or part of a day during which the offence has continued.

### **5.3 Other costs and expenses**

- (1) A person who is convicted of an offence under this local law is to be liable, in addition to any penalty imposed under clause 5.2, to pay to the local

government the costs and expenses incurred by the local government in taking remedial action such as—

- (a) removing and lawfully disposing of toxic, hazardous or poisonous waste; or
  - (b) making good any damage caused to a waste facility.
- (2) The costs and expenses incurred by the local government are to be recoverable, as a debt due to the local government, in a court of competent civil jurisdiction.

#### **5.4 Prescribed offences**

- (1) An offence against a clause specified in Schedule 2 is a prescribed offence for the purposes of section 9.16(1) of the LG Act.
- (2) The amount of the modified penalty for a prescribed offence is that specified adjacent to the clause in Schedule 2.

#### **5.5 Form of notices**

- (1) Where a vehicle is involved in the commission of an offence, the form of the notice referred to in section 9.13 of the LG Act is that of Form 1 in Schedule 1 of the LG Regulations.
- (2) The form of the infringement notice given under section 9.16 of the LG Act is that of Form 2 in Schedule 1 of the LG Regulations.
- (3) The form of the infringement withdrawal notice given under section 9.20 of the LG Act is that of Form 3 in Schedule 1 of the LG Regulations.



**Schedule 1 - Meaning of 'non-collectable waste'**  
[Clause 1.5(1)]

**non-collectable waste** means –

- (a) hot or burning material;
- (b) household hazardous waste, including paint, acids, alkalis, fire extinguishers, solvents, pesticides, oils, gas cylinders, batteries, chemicals and heavy metals;
- (c) any other hazardous material, such as radioactive waste;
- (d) any explosive material, such as flares or ammunition;
- (e) electrical and electronic equipment;
- (f) hospital, medical, veterinary, laboratory or pathological substances;
- (g) construction or demolition waste;
- (h) sewage;
- (i) 'controlled waste' for the purposes of the *Environmental Protection (Controlled Waste) Regulations 2004*;
- (j) any object that is greater in length, width, or breadth than the corresponding dimension of the receptacle or that will not allow the lid of the receptacle to be tightly closed;
- (k) waste that is or is likely to become offensive or a nuisance, or give off an offensive or noxious odour, or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in non-absorbent or impervious material or placed in a sealed impervious and leak-proof container; and
- (l) any other waste determined by the local government to be non-collectable waste.
